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June Council Meeting Matters

- Council agreed in principle to the renaming of the Section of Emmaus Road and Gum Vale Road that runs from the Australia Plains Road through to Sutherlands Road intersection to become Australia Plains Road.
- The revised Volunteer was adopted.
- The Tenders Policy was rescinded.
- The Vandalism Policy was rescinded.
- The Tourism Policy was rescinded.
- The revised Meetings of Council Policy was adopted.
- The fee for powered sites at the Burra Caravan Park will be increased to \$30.00 per night from 1st July 2015.
- The Willalo Hall will be demolished at the cost thereof be funded from General Revenue. Councils Building Assessment & Assets Officer will undertake the following:
 - Photograph the Willalo Hall prior to demolition work commencing and provide copies of such photographs to local history groups.
 - Engage a licensed asbestos removal contractor to undertake the removal of all asbestos as detailed in the building's asbestos register from the Willalo Hall prior to removal of reusable timber flooring.
 - Arrange for the removal of all reusable timber floorings from the Willalo Hall by Council employees and deliver such salvage to the Burra Mens Shed prior to the demolition of the Willalo Hall.
 - Engage a licensed demolition contractor to demolish the Willalo Hall and associated outbuildings.
 - Arrange for the supply/installation of a plaque in commemoration of the Willalo Hall (in consultation with local Willalo residents in regard to design and location) and planting of Australian Native trees on the site.
- The amended terms of reference for the Goyder Youth Advisory Committee was adopted.
- Council will forward a letter to the Bank SA strongly advising of their concerns of the decision to reduce the services provided to the Burra & Eudunda branches, emphasizing the detrimental impact this will have on the community and local businesses.

20 Years of Service

On Tuesday 23rd June, Mayor Peter Matthey presented Cr. Adrian Gill a certificate of appreciation to mark his milestone 20 years of service to Local Government.

Cr. Adrian Gill was elected to District Council of Burra Burra in May 1995, where thirteen candidates contested seven positions. Out of 731 votes, Cr. Gill received 74 first preferences and 18 other, making a total of 92 votes.

Following the amalgamation of the former District Councils of Burra Burra, Eudunda, Hallett and Robertstown the Regional Council of Goyder was formed in February 1997. With 7 nominations and only 5 positions available, Cr. Gill was successful and elected to the Burra Ward.

COUNCIL IN BRIEF

- Roadside drainage works to improve road maintenance may require Council to enter private property.
- Assistance of the Hummocks Soil Board will be sought regarding the flood management of Cartapo Creek system.
- Flood mitigation work to be carried out near Bon Accord Hotel and a new creek crossing to be budgeted for 1993/94.
- Removal of tree suckers in creek to be undertaken near O'Connor's Shed.
- Request to Department of Primary Industries to budget for locust control in this area for spring hatchings.
- Building applications for March - \$123,164.
- Booborowie community congratulated for their celebration of a sealed road to the Burra/Spalding road.
- Burra Golf Club access to be sealed. The club to contribute \$1,000.
- Footpaths around Paxton Square Cottages to be included in budget discussions for 1993/94.
- Burra Arts Council granted approval to hold a Market Day on Saturday 1st May at the picnic area of the Burra Creek between 10.00 a.m. and 8.00 p.m.
- Burra Traders granted approval to hold Easter Street Fair on Sunday, 11th April.
- Concern expressed to State and Federal agencies regarding the railway bridges and infrastructure at Burra railway station. National Trust shares Council's concerns.
- Mr I. Auhl's continuing actions in the conservation, protection and promotion of Burra appreciated by Council.
- Council to inspect problem sites where watercourses near Mt. Bryan and Booborowie are obstructed.
- Council to contribute \$336 to the operation of the Mid North Rural Counselling and Information Service.
- Concern expressed to reduction of radio choice and availability to country listeners as a result of metropolitan radio stations converting from the AM to FM band.
- Contribution of \$5,000 to be forwarded to Student Boarding Facility.
- Investigation on removal of pine trees in John Barker Street with more suitable trees.
- May Council meeting relocated to Monday 24th May.
- Options for Management of the Tourist Office to be presented at the April meeting.
- GTS BKN (Spencer Gulf Telecasters) has indicated that Channel 4 should be on UHF before June 1993.
- Nine (9) nominations received for the seven vacancies for Councillor. Elections to be held on Saturday 1st May. Advance voting papers available. Notices published in Northern Argus.
- Burra's entrant in the 1993 Gliderol Variety Bash supported by Council through sponsorship of the Lewis Board of Management (Paxton Square Cottages) and the Burra Tourist Association.
- Over 50 applications received for the temporary clerical position at Council.
- Work is progressing at Burra Town Hall with painting to be completed before Antique and Decorators Fair.
