# Burra wayfinding and interpretive signage strategy, design review and upgrade proposal

The Regional Council of Goyder have secured some funding to upgrade their wayfinding and interpretive signage at Burra. An audit of all the existing signage is underway by council.

This project is split into two key stages:

## **STAGE 1 - Briefing, wayfinding strategy, masterplan and signage suite design & development.**

- Review the existing signage design, interpretive trails, wayfinding strategies and audit documents.
- Make recommendations for improvements to overall Burra wayfinding and interpretive strategies.
- Make recommendations for signage upgrade priorities in collaboration with council and select a first priority upgrade project.
- Design and develop concepts for a new suite of wayfinding and interpretive signage that can be used across all Burra sites.

## **STAGE 2 - Detail design and specification for 1st priority project (Tbc)**

- Prepare detailed designs and specifications for the first priority signage upgrade project including engineering and specifications for all signage structures, research and development of interpretive content, text and images as required, in conjunction with a writer / historian and local history organisations.
- Source costings for the production and installation of the first priority upgrade project
- Scope and fees tbc pending outcomes of Stage 1 works.

## **STAGE 3 - Construction and installation management for 1st priority project (Tbc)**

- Manage the production and installation of the first priority signage upgrade project
- Scope and fees tbc pending outcomes of Stage 1 works.

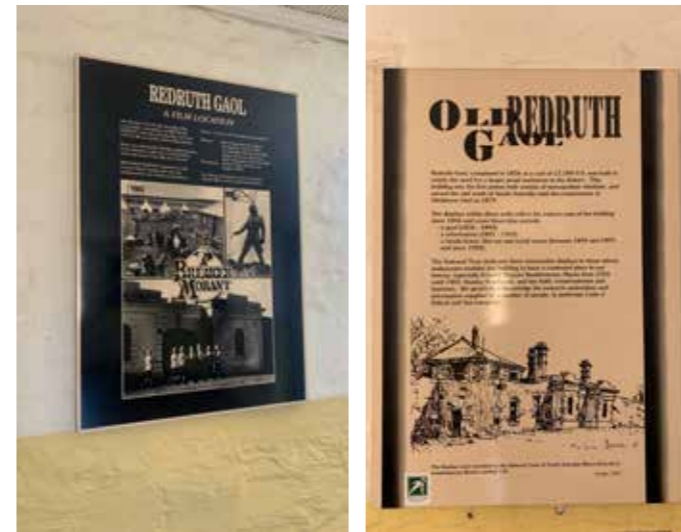
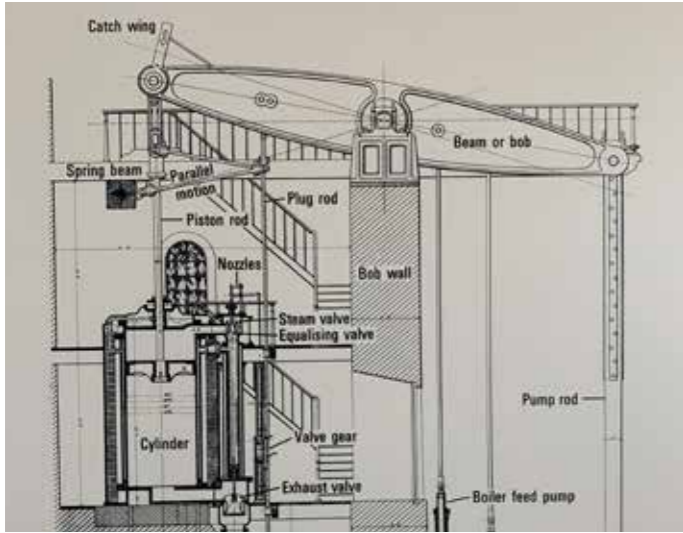

Much of the existing signage is quite old and in need of repair or replacement. The signage design varies greatly in terms of form, colour, typography and graphic style. Many sign clusters could be consolidated onto one sign to reduce visual clutter.

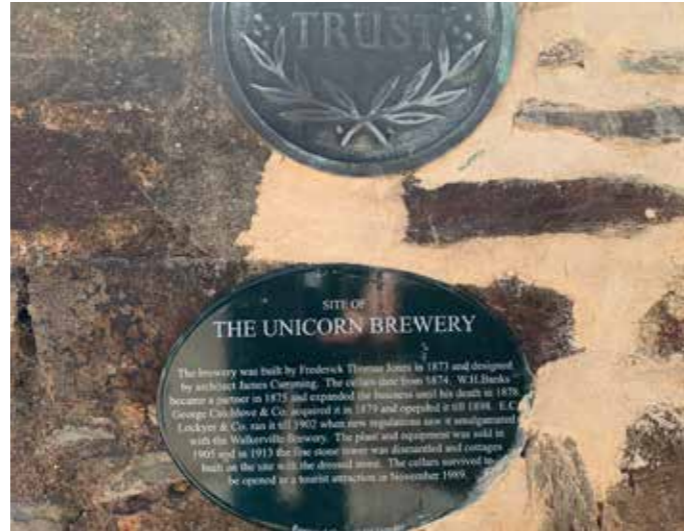




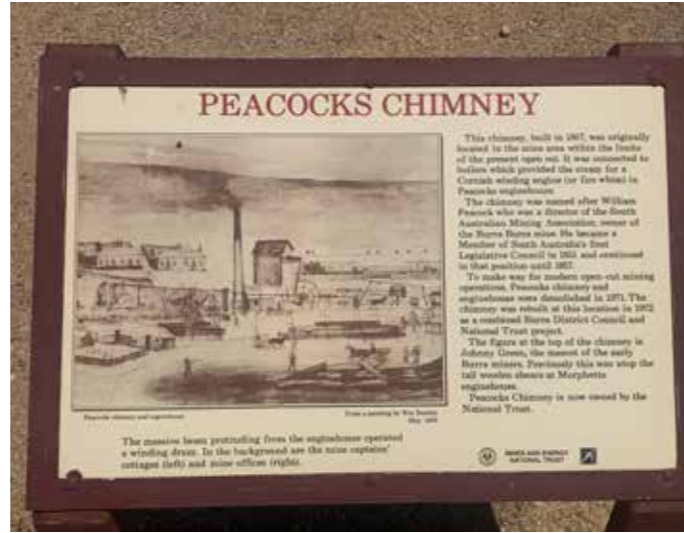

**OPTION 1 - THE ENGINE HOUSE LOOP TRAIL**

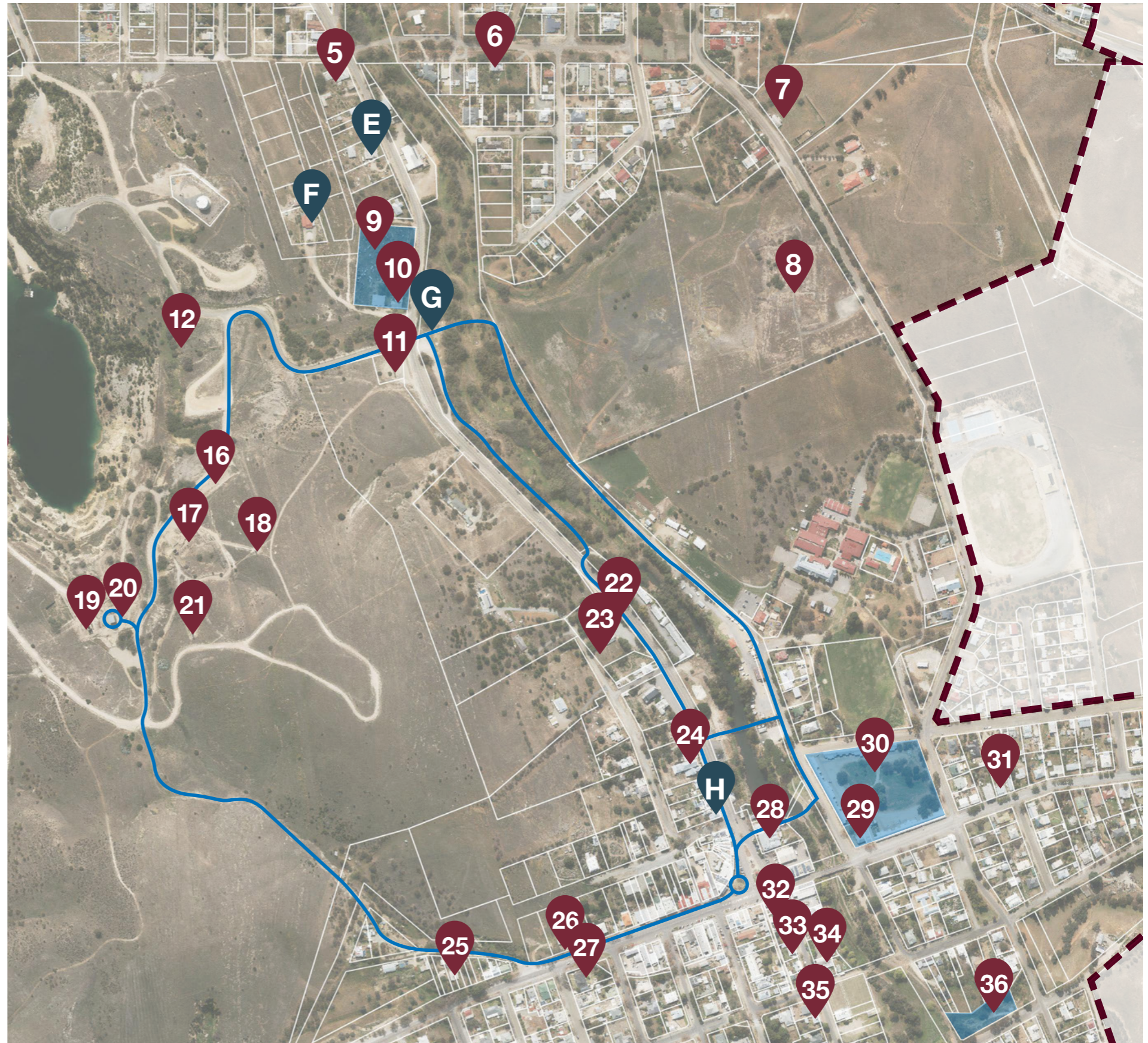

There would be trailhead map signs at these locations that show the overall route, walking times and interpretation on the key sites and destinations along the way. This is a moderate to easy walking trail level with an estimated return time of around 2-3hrs tbc. The trail section from Morphett's Engine house south to the township needs to be established. The miners used to walk this same route to town.

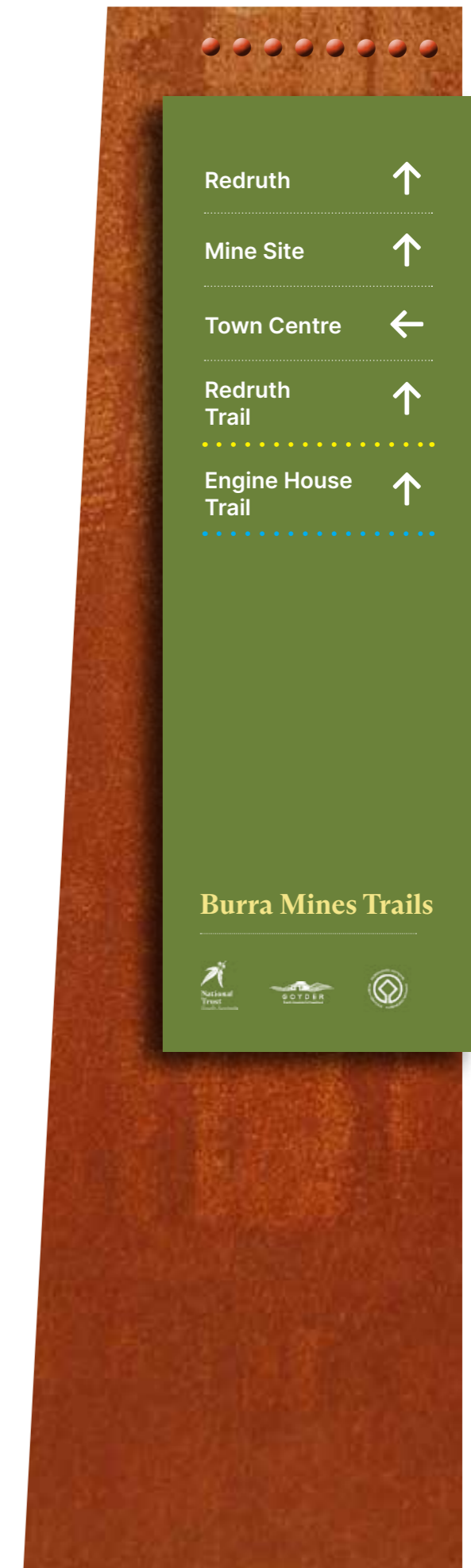
